


What is POP ART?

The pieces of work below are by artist Takashi Murakami.





Context

Murakami is a Japanese Artist, born in 1962. He still lives and works in **Tokyo**. He is often compared to **Pop Artists** like Andy Warhol because of the way he turns **commercial** art into **Fine Art** that would be seen in an art gallery. Where Andy Warhol would use images from advertising, such as Coke Bottles and Soup Cans, Murakami uses images from **Menga and Anime**. He has also been **influenced** by **traditional** Japanese printmaking techniques. Murakami's work can be seen in a wide variety of places, from the cover of Kanye West's album Graduation, to the fashion label of Louis Vuitton, to the Guggenheim Museum (Spain) and the Palace of Versailles (France).










Slab Technique



Create a rough flat pancake shape by pressing the clay flat



This will create a flat slab of clay.



Roll out the clay, turning the clay over and rolling the opposite way. The clay will gradually get bigger. Make your clay about 1 cm thick



You can then use a clay tool knife to cut out the shape you require. This technique of rolling clay into slabs will allow you to cut out shapes then build up your POP art designs.



Embossing Clay to create textures

Embossing is when you press a design into clay






Relief is when you build onto the clay, so the surface is raised



Draw out your image, carefully lay on your clay. Carefully create the outline of the image by gently scoring the clay.


