Qualifications

Qualification	Description
GCSE (General Certificate of Secondary Education)	There is an opportunity to repeat Maths and English GCSE's in College if you have received lower than a grade 4 initially. It is
	usually completed as part of a level 2 course.
GCE AS Levels (Advanced Subsidiary Level)	AS results will no longer count towards an A level. AS courses will be linear assessments typically taking place after one year of study.

GCSE A Levels (Advanced Level)	A levels are studied over 2 years with assessments taking place at the end of the second year. Most subjects have now been reformed to this format.
BTEC (Business and Technology Education Council) course	These are qualifications covering a wide range of work related areas, e.g. Health and Social Care, Engineering etc. It is a qualification recognised by Universities and Employers. They are available at Level 1, 2 and 3.
BTEC Level 2 Diploma BTEC Level 3 Diploma and Extended Diploma	The BTEC Level 2 is a 1-year Vocational Course that could lead to BTEC Level 3 Diploma. Four grade 3's are required for the BTEC Level 2.
	BTEC Level 3 Diploma is a two-year course equivalent to 2 A levels and requires four grade 4's or above including English Language and Maths BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma is a two year course equivalent to 3 A levels and requires five grade 4's or above including English Language and Maths.
Level 1 and Entry Level	These courses come into the Foundation Learning set of qualifications.
NVQ's (National Vocational Qualifications)	NVQ's are vocational qualifications that measure a person's ability to complete a job. They can take between 1 and 2 years to complete and are always completed whilst on an apprenticeship which is employed status. Students who gain 5 GCSE at grades 3 and above usually start on NVQ 2 and progress to NVQ level 3, students with qualifications lower than this will start at Foundation Learning Stage.
Apprenticeships	Students are required to achieve 4/5 GCSE's at a minimum of grade 3 to start an Intermediate or Level 2 Apprenticeship. and 5 GCSE's at grade 4 or above (including English Language) for a Level 3/Advanced Apprenticeship. Students can start on an NVQ 2 and progress to an NVQ 3. Students have to have an employer to embark on an Apprenticeship. Students achieving lower than a grade 4 can access work based training via a Foundation Learning Programme/Traineeships (pre-apprenticeships)
T Levels	T Levels are new, technical qualifications and are equivalent to 3 A Levels. They offer a mix of classroom study and work based learning, including an industry placement. They include subjects such as; Construction, Digital, Education, Engineering and Childcare.
