Pathways from Year 11

There are 3 main pathways:

- 1. Academic pathway 6th Forms/Colleges
- 2. Apprenticeship/work-based learning pathway
- 3. Vocational pathway College





Academic Pathway: AS/A Levels

- Ideas and knowledge
- Assessed mainly by exams
- Normally require at least 5 GCSE grades 9-4
- Some subjects expect grades 9-5 / 9-6
- Typically 3 A Levels studied (sometimes 4)
- AS Levels are equivalent to around 40% of an A Level and only a small number are available locally.





Apprenticeship Pathway

- Apprenticeships are jobs that pay a wage
- They involve 80% work, 20% training
- The training is at different levels
- Entry requirements are set by the employer and depend partly on the level of training
- You need to be able to fit into a workplace ('work ready')





Apprenticeship Levels

Intermediate – Level 2

Training equivalent to GCSE grades 9-4

May need at least grades 3 or equivalent, or selection tests

Advanced – Level 3

Training equivalent to A Level

Often requires grades 9-4 or equivalent

Higher / Degree - Levels 4-6 (age 18+)

Lead to higher education / professional qualifications





Work Based Learning

Work based learning can give you skills and experience to help you get an apprenticeship. It offers:

- Learning in a workplace or work environment
- Help with job hunting, CVs and interviews
- Support with English and Maths
- Examples include Traineeships and Study Programmes





Vocational Pathway

- You study a job or area of work at college
- Entry requirements may be flexible as you can often study at different levels
- Leads to qualifications such as BTEC, NVQ,
 T Levels at levels 1, 2 or 3



Qualification Levels



Levels 4-6 (higher education)

Normally require Level 3 qualifications, e.g. A Level, BTEC National.

Level 3 (e.g. A Level, BTEC National, T Levels, advanced apprenticeship)

Normally requires at least GCSE grades 9-4 or equivalent.

Level 2 (e.g. BTEC First, NVQ 2, intermediate apprenticeship)

Normally requires GCSE grades 3 or equivalent.

Level 1 (e.g. BTEC Level 1, NVQ 1)

Normally requires GCSE grades 1-2 or equivalent.

Entry Level (e.g. Entry Level Functional Skills)

No set entry requirements.

Aiming at Higher Education?

The main routes at 16+

- A Levels.
- Vocational qualifications at Level 3.
- A mix of the two.
- Some apprenticeships (at Level 3).

Things to consider

- Some qualifications are suited to certain courses.
- Some not all higher education courses want specific subjects.





Higher education: The Cost

- **Tuition:** currently up to £9,250 a year covered by a student loan so *not* paid in advance.
- Living costs: e.g. rent if you live away from home.

Help includes:

- Student loans repayments start when you earn over a certain amount. Repayments are based on what you earn, not what you owe.
- Bursaries for some students / courses no repayment
 Stop Press: Some of this may change!





Money





Child Benefit

Paid until age 20 if you are in:

- Full time approved learning e.g. college, sixth form.
- Approved work based-learning that doesn't pay a wage, e.g. study programme, traineeship.

Not paid if you are in:

- A job / apprenticeship.
- Higher education.





16-19 Bursary

Vulnerable Bursary

Up £1,200 if you're in full time learning and:

- In or leaving care.
- Receive Universal Credit or certain other benefits in your own name.

Discretionary Bursary

Might be paid
 if you're in full time
 learning and facing
 hardship but can't get a
 Vulnerable Bursary.
